## Teaching and Learning

Welcome back to Term 2. Hopefully the holiday was an enjoyable and restful one for everyone within the community. My thanks go to Mrs Brandenburg and Mrs Brims who covered various duties last term in my Long Service Leave absence. This term is always very busy and culminates in the last week with Community Week (formerly known as Week of Excellence) and the Year 12 Formal evening.

At the end of last Term, Interim Reports were provided electronically to parents. You would have read that the End of Semester Reports will only be provided electronically unless a paper copy is specifically requested. The report is available via the Parent Portal, which also has the link to make bookings for the Parent Teacher Student interviews. As well, the portal has

the ability to store the last 2 years' worth of reports for your daughter. There are other features, such as absence statistics and timetables which parents would find useful.

Students have moved away from file storage on their laptops to a more reliable format used in the "cloud" provided by BCE. This ensures that, should a catastrophe occur with the laptop, student files and assignments are safe in a location where they and their teachers have access and no important data is at risk. Importantly, computer catastrophe is not a valid excuse for late or non-submission of assessment items. Because of the cloud storage requirement, student files are available on any computer or device using the student's online credentials. Students are repeatedly warned that local storage of assessment should be only as a local backup of the "cloud" version.

The latest version of LIFE, our BCE Learning Management System, is providing an efficient venue for the presentation of curriculum information to students. There are future plans for parent's access to some of this information through the portals. Parents have already commented favourably on the information available in the portal and the phone app from BCE.

## QCS Preparation

Students in Year 12 are busily preparing for the QCS Test next term. After exam block, students in Year 12 will undertake two full-day practice sessions for the QCS during Community Week. This gives the College a unique opportunity to receive feedback about our students' progress in time for final preparations in Term 3. As well, our Year 11 students will commence their preparations for QCS by sitting an introductory test to gain specific information about their strengths in order to prepare for their targeted lessons commencing in Term 4.

## Parent Teacher Student Interviews

All parents should now have the specific log-in details for parents to book interviews for the upcoming Parent/Teacher/Student interviews on Wednesday May 4. The logon procedures have been automated through the access to the student portal system. Access to the portals provides a tremendous amount of information, forms, and links that are simply not possible via paper. As well, we have a more convenient process that gives parents maximum flexibility and convenience.

These important discussions give more information for parents to be able to support the education of their daughters. Popular questions are, "My daughter seems to be working very hard and studying all of the time. Is this reflected in her grades?" and "What can I do at home to ensure appropriate use of the laptops?" Other questions involve homework, test preparation, specific subject skill sets etc. In the recent reports, teachers indicated with a tick or cross whether an interview was necessary. If an interview was not "necessary" at this point, please know that they are always welcome.

It is important to remember that students will be dismissed from the College at 12.25pm (the beginning of lunchtime) on this day in order to allow all to prepare for the interviews. Whilst we do try to be flexible, often, teachers are fully booked and longer conversations will need to be conducted outside of these interview times.

## Contacting Specific Teachers

Other methods for contacting teachers involve email and telephone calls through the office. A complete list of emails is provided on the College Parent Portal website under the heading "School Directory". As mentioned before, your daughter's teachers' names are available on the BCE app. The best option of these two is email, as often a teacher will be in class for most of the day and will be unable to take your call. If they are off the property, they may still be in email contact if the situation allows.

## Student Emails

All students have a school email account. We encourage them to use this address and to check regularly as this is the most efficient way to ensure that messages are conveyed. Teachers can send instructions and resources directly to their classes with ease using this medium. Lists are maintained by the school timetable program so students will not miss out on important information this way.

Students have a single sign-on process which gives them the same passwords for login, email, portal access, access to LIFE, printing etc.

## NAPLAN

This month, the Year 7 and 9 students will participate in the National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN). This has been designed to test the skills of students in literacy and numeracy in order to report to parents/carers and schools and to accommodate the assessment of students against the national benchmark standards. However, these tests only form part of the assessment taken by specific students during the course of their schooling life. When the feedback and results are supplied, they should be analysed in conjunction with school-based assessments and read in partnership with individual summative student reports prepared by the College. Importantly, the College strongly encourages all students to participate in the NAPLAN tests as these provide rich information which we use to specifically cater for your daughter's learning requirements.

There are great number of events happening and the whole community is indeed very busy – often handling multiple things at once. It is important for us all to take a breath every now and then, to realise that not all stress is bad, and that often we can be energized and inspired by those who take a moment to notice the tremendous efforts of our parent community, students, teachers and leaders.

Enjoy the fortnight ahead.

## Community Matters

Welcome back to Term 2. I hope that the Easter break proved to be a restful and rejuvenating time for you all and allowed you some time for bonding as a family, even if it was just over chocolate eggs. There are many exciting events happening this term beginning with Year 10 Camp in Week 2 and finishing with

the Year 12 formal in June. For parents of students in Year 8 and 9 a 'save the date' request for Tuesday May 16 at 2:00pm. This will be a time to share in an afternoon tea with some of the Pastoral Care staff that work with your daughters. Invitations and more information to come at a later date.

A reminder to parents in regards to the procedure for their daughter if they are feeling unwell at school. The student should ask their classroom teacher for permission to go to sickbay for a break from class so that they can hopefully recover and return to their normal lessons at a later stage. Once at sick bay staff ensure that students are free of all distractions (books, laptops, mobile phones etc.) so that they are able to rest for fifteen minutes. After this time, staff encourage students to return to class if they are able to do so. If they are not, a staff member will contact the parent/guardian to collect their child from school. It is important that all phone numbers on your daughter's emergency contact list are up to date for this reason. Your daughter should not make contact with you directly as it is vital that the school is aware if your daughter is unwell and about to leave the grounds for this reason. When you arrive at school it is imperative that you present at the main office to collect your child and officially sign her out of the school grounds. This practice ensures the safety of all students in the College.

If your child is late to school, before entering the classroom, she should present at the student services office with her ID Card, College Diary and a note explaining the reason that she is late. If you have been unable to provide her with a note please call the office to explain the situation. Your support in these procedures is greatly appreciated as it assists staff in providing the best care for your daughters.

### Instrumental Music

This year, we welcome back our specialist instrumental music teachers Miss Mrs Ruth Ross-Pe'er (Thursday lessons - strings and voice), Miss Alana Beasley (Thursday lessons - piano) and Mr Aaron Damianopolius (Tuesday lessons – guitar and drums). This year we also welcome Miss Louise McGill to our instrumental staff. Miss McGill brings her talent and specialist expertise to the Our Lady's College community, in the field of woodwind, brass, percussion and ensemble direction. Miss McGill will be teaching at the College every Monday.

The Instrumental Music program at OLC is an orchestral and vocal program. Tuition in all of the following instruments is offered. **Strings:** violin, cello, double bass and guitar. **Woodwind:** flute, clarinet, saxophone. **Brass:** trumpet, trombone and euphonium. **Percussion:** drums, tuned and untuned percussion and piano. **Voice:** classical and modern voice.

Lessons occur weekly on a rotational timetable, and can be given in small groups (\$17 per week), shared private (\$22 per week) or individual lessons (\$32 per week). Private students are given the opportunity (if requested) to prepare for external exams including AMEB, Trinity and ANZCA. If certain conditions are met, these exams can contribute points toward the QCE.


