Next week, Our Lady's College celebrates the feast day of St Mary MacKillop, the co-founder of the Josephite order and Australia's first saint. Our Lady's College was founded by the Josephite sisters and this year marks 150 years since Mary MacKillop first came to the Archdiocese of Brisbane with her Sisters. Mary came to Brisbane and started St Joseph's School, Kangaroo Point. Perhaps Mary is best known for saying *"never see a need without doing something about it".* Mary saw a need and did something about it – she brought her Sisters to Queensland to bring Catholic education to the families of not just the fledgling town of Brisbane, but also to the rural Maryborough. Mary, with her Sisters, was a pioneer for Catholic education in Australia. We are the beneficiaries of their legacy.

Preparing for the Future

In the last week Year 10s and Year 12s have been preparing to make decisions for the future. Year 10s are preparing to make senior subject choices and Year 12s will start applying for tertiary study through the Queensland Tertiary Admissions Centre from next week.

Regardless of the pathway our students choose, ultimately the long-term goal is for students to find employment in an area they find meaningful and fulfilling.

COVID-19 has brought uncertainty around future job growth and job security and we don't yet know the short- or long-term impacts the pandemic will bring. There are some factors that research shows assist young people to transition faster from full-time study to full-time employment (Foundation for Young Australians, 2018). These factors are likely to remain relevant for our young people post-COVID. They are:

- **Build "enterprise skills"** such as communication, problem solving and teamwork.
- Paid employment that relates to future career goals. If you find paid employment in the career field of your interest it is likely to speed your transition to full time employment.
- Paid employment in future-focussed job areas. Young people who were studying in health, professional and technical services, and information technology areas and gained paid employment in these fields, had an advantage.
- Be positive. Young people who were optimistic about their ability to find full-time work in their career area of interest began working 2 months faster than a young person who was not optimistic about their career prospects.

It is important that we support young people to set realistic timeframes for achieving career goals, encourage them to maximise their employability, and provide them with current research to guide them in career related decisions.
