Principal's Message





Happy World Teachers Day!

Today, on behalf of the Our Lady's College families, the College P & F Association arranged morning tea to thank all staff for their dedication to the education of our girls. We are grateful for the acknowledgement and support of the P & F. We are also grateful to the students who created a video thanking Our Lady's teachers for all that they do. The Importance of Reading to Enhance Learning Outcomes

Developing a love of reading is essential to quality learning, and so is a priority for us. During last term, our Year 7s engaged in ROLCA (Reading: Our Lady's College, Annerley). There is much research about the importance of reading. A student who reads 20 minutes each day (or 3600 minutes in a school year), covers approximately 1,800,000 words and sits in the 90th percentile for successful learning. This compares with a student who reads for just 5 minutes each day (or 900 minutes in a school year) covering 282,000 words and sits in the 50th percentile for successful learning.


Reading is something that is best to be tapped into from infancy, with parents first of all reading aloud to their children and then encouraging reading as their children grow in independence. It's vital we let them read what they choose themselves. By developing a love of literature in all its forms, young people will:

- Improve their reading and comprehension, which assists them in all their subjects
- Build a stronger vocabulary
- Develop confidence with all forms of language style and structure

These technical skills are incredibly important, but it's the intangible benefits that are also important:

- Develop empathy and compassion for unfamiliar people and situations
- On average, readers have better physical health, mental health and empathy
- Reading for as little as 6 minutes can reduce stress by 60%, slow heartbeat, ease muscle tension and alter your state of mind.

Mrs Buckley (our very own reading promoter in Ad Altiora Place) explains that libraries perform obvious roles such as providing access to many forms of texts, but they do more as well. Our ROLCA (ReadOLCA) program requires students to read across a range of genres and reach a target number of 10 books. I enjoyed the opportunity to present the students with certificates and prizes for first, second and third at the Year 7 Assembly this week.



As you can see from the graph above showing reading results on NAPLAN in 2019 (red dot is Our Lady's College), programs such as this, together with excellent teaching, is benefitting our girls. We are in the quadrant of growth achieving above

the Australian average and above the Australian effect size for learning. A great result!


