Teaching and Learning

Welcome back to students and staff of the Our Lady's College community and a warm welcome to our many new students and staff in all year levels.

Results

Huge congratulations go out to our past Year 12 students for their performances in their final results. Students in the ATAR 90+ range have been invited back to our first assembly and inducted into the Green & Gold Club. Statistically speaking, we had 41% of our students with an ATAR above 90.0

Timetables

The number of study lessons created by studying external or offline courses means that, on non-TAFE days, students will be required to go to Ad Altiora Place to catch up on any work missed while on their TAFE or University courses

Laptops

Laptops have been distributed in the first days of the year. Like mobile phones, there are times when laptops provide tremendous support to students and times when they can be a distraction. Please embrace good sense when setting boundaries at home for these devices.

Simply:

- Internet access should be supervised all of the timeconsider whether the location for the computer allows for easy monitoring by parents. "Researching" behind a closed bedroom door is never advisable. Ensure that you can see the screen as you walk past (not that your daughter can see you before you get to the screen).
- Communication Technology has "off time" if your daughter cannot yet self-limit her use of email, chat or other communication technologies, make sure that the computer "recharges" overnight in your bedroom. This will reduce the temptation to stay up late into the evening.
- It never hurts to ask ask you daughter how the computers are being used in the classrooms. Ask the teachers. Talk with other parents about good study habits etc.

Safety before and after school

The College precinct traffic management plan is available on the College Parent Portal. It outlines the various traffic zones and rules to ensure the safety of the community. The college is not able to accept responsibility for any loss or damage to vehicles on or around the property.

The College has teacher supervision in the area outside the student lockers every morning from 8.15am until the start of PC. Unless students have a scheduled supervised activity, they should aim to arrive at school at 8.15am. Ad Altiora Place Library is open for students to quietly work, study, print documents etc from 7.30am in the mornings (Mon to Fri) if students need to be dropped off earlier than the recommended time. After school, there is also staff supervision in the Drop-Off zone outside Ad Altiora Place until 3.10pm. Again, the Library is open for students until 4pm (Mon – Thurs) and closes at 3pm on Fridays.

Our Lady's alumnus Clare Collins named Laureate Professor



Our Lady's College community warmly congratulates former student, Clare Collins, who has been awarded the title of Laureate Professor at The University of Newcastle.

Clare is only the second woman at the university, and the first for the Faculty of Health and Medicine, to receive this honour.

The professor of nutrition and dietetics has been breaking the mould since graduating from OLC in 1977.

She was the first in her family to attend university where she earned her Bachelor of Science and later her PhD.

"I didn't come from a family where people had been to university before - and there were five girls before there were any boys," she told the Newcastle Herald.

"At that time, it was unusual for women to be allowed to go to university or finish school. To be a first-in-family and female, I really do hope it lights the way for others.

"Hopefully, they'll tread that path, and people behind them will tread that path, and after that it will be a smooth highway in years to come."

Clare said her time at Our Lady's – particularly her Biology teacher Mr Cook – sparked her interest in nutrition science.

"Mr Cook was so passionate about Biology that you were drawn into the subject by his enthusiasm," she said.

"He showed me how much you can influence those around you when you share your passion for your area of expertise.

"My love of science and particularly helping people understand nutrition science has continued to grow since then."

Even today, more than 40 years since graduating, Clare can still recall the way in which Our Lady's helped inspire her later achievements.

"I am grateful for the extra freedom and support Our Lady's allowed me to develop both personally and academically," she said.

"I loved the range of opportunities the College provided, allowing me to transition into a more independent learner."
